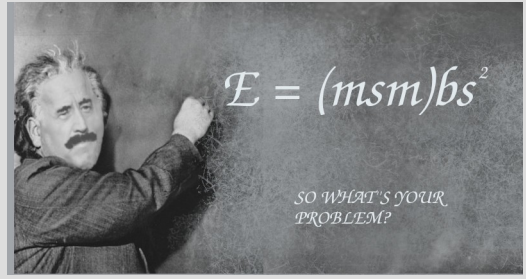


PROFESSOR BIDENSTEIN PROVES THE THEORY OF IRRATIONALITY

The "Theory of Irrationality"—is that just a pun on Einstein's famous theory? A pun, yes, but not an irrelevant pun. It introduces quite a serious subject, call it what you like. Do you have a strong suspicion, or a strong conviction, that something is terribly wrong in our government; but you can't prove it, or convince people who think climate change and Donald Trump are their greatest enemies, and abortion their greatest freedom? Now, thanks to Professor Bidenstein, we have indisputable mathematical proof that you are right, something is terribly, irrationally, dangerously, wrong!



Among other questionable actions, our government and its allied media and academic establishment, have declared war on the fossil fuels industry, vowing to destroy it in the next few years. Unlike questions in molecular biology and immunology, though, most Americans have the ability to understand the ramifications of our government's 'victory' in its war on fossil fuels. But before discussing the ramifications, let's just get into the math and let you decide what it means. And please check it out for yourself, don't just take my word for it, or discount this warning out of hand.

According to US government figures (I know, but let's assume they are correct), in 2021 Americans consumed approximately 135 billion gallons of auto gasoline. Each gallon of gasoline contains the equivalent energy of 33.5 kwh (kilowatt hours) of electricity. That means we consumed about 5 trillion kwh energy equivalent from gasoline alone. The total electric energy production in the US in 2021 was approximately 4 trillion kwh.

Therefore, even if we drained every spark from our already overburdened electric grid, we couldn't replace gasoline. When you add in replacing diesel, kerosene, home heating oil, etc., we haven't a third of the electric power we would need to support our population and maintain our existence as a modern nation.

But not only is oil under attack, so is coal, which produces about 20 percent of our electric energy, and without which many industries we depend upon would collapse. Natural gas is also a fossil fuel, from which we derive about 40 percent of our electricity, a high percentage of home heating, and innumerable consumer goods (plastics, fertilizers, fabrics, pharmaceuticals, etc., etc., etc.) It is produced by drilling, principally, but not entirely, as a by-product of oil drilling, and our president has also declared war on "drilling". Does that include drilling for natural gas? Who knows.

What is our government thinking about in this war on the American people (not really on the fossil fuel industry, which is booming in countries not committed to their own self-destruction)? Vague assurances about solar and wind power investments, and media hype about "green energy" raised to any power don't produce energy. The expectation that we can just switch to electric cars when we get enough charging stations (never mind affordability, and availability of batteries, etc.) is just plain *irrational*; there is no other word for it (or is there?).

Next to 'victory' in our government's war on fossil fuels, climate change would seem a walk in the park; but I'll leave that dystopian future to your imagination. Yes, Joe Biden is a senile old fool who doesn't know what he is talking about, but is he behind it? The most charitable explanation is that he is lying about his intentions simply to court favor with climate fanatics, who, frightened as children by Al Gore, grew into neurotic, but dependable voters. Just how far will he go for their support? Who knows that? Or is this destructive impetus bought and paid for by our enemies in Peking, or Moscow, or the World Economic Forum whose motto is "We don't need all those people."

Doubtless all those factors contribute to this sorry situation, but the burden of responsibility for it rests with the American people, both the leadership, and the masses who, by and large, accept this irrational energy policy, and many others just as bad, or worse, without question. This brings me to the "Theory of Irrationality". From what does irrationality stem?

In many instances, ignorance, naivety and credulity can be construed as the source of irrational behavior by those who happen to know better; and public education has been deliberately 'dumbed down' for generations with mis-education, and indoctrination of its charges into thoughtless social conformity. Certainly, that is part of the answer, but not the most sinister and dangerous root of the irrational behavior we see all around us.
