JUST SO YOU WILL KNOW: ICE DOES COVER THE ARCTIC OCEAN, Although you wouldn't know it from most satellite imagery.

This is just a note on something that struck me a few days ago. In looking at radar weather maps, the base maps never show any ice in the northern latitudes, except the Greenland ice cap. Now, I'm not trying to make something of it, I'm just pointing out that despite the appearances on most satellite maps, the Arctic Ocean is ice covered, as it should be in winter.

All the following screen shots were taken between 3/14/2023 and 3/19/2023. You will notice that NASA photos of 3/14/23 and 3/18/23 (from different web sites) show ice cover of the Arctic Sea. Google, the National Weather Service, Weather Chanel, and ABC News maps (and the other MSM weather radar maps) do not show any sea ice coverage. They are obviously using a land map, rather than a 'real time' photo base. So don't think you can go yachting on the Arctic Ocean because you don't see any ice on weather maps.
